I am writing to you out of despair. Hopeless as I am, I believe you are the only ones who could ease my pain, but before all else, I need to tell you the story of me and her.



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A Cry for Help

Our planet's natural resources have been overused and the problems that have arisen start to become more threatening each passing day.

Firstly, there are other alternatives to obtain energy. For instance we can use special mirrors to capture enough solar energy for several households in a way that doesn't eliminate tons of CO2.

Another alternative is the controlled nuclear fusion, a process which can produce the quantity of energy contained in 80 000 l of oil by using the deuterium and tritium from a glass of water.

Secondly, we should turn to environmental friendly cars, such as the electric car or cars that use diesel obtained from plastic bags. Nuclear batteries based on water and a radioactive isotope can produce electrical energy for electric cars.
